Thank You to the Conine Family Foundation



Bikes Not Bombs is delighted to share the news that the Conine Family Foundation has recently awarded us a grant of \$100,000! This gift will enable us to expand our community engagement team in 2022, increasing our reach and capacity to collect, process, and distribute bicycles across all of our programs — in Jamaica Plain and at our new Roxbury Hub. Our efforts to reclaim bicycles out of the waste stream ensures:

- Young people in our programs have access to bikes to refurbish and keep as their own
- Youth Apprentices have access to bikes to refurbish for people experiencing economic hardship
- The Bike Shop has bikes to refurbish and sell to our neighbors
- Our international partners have bikes to power their environmental and social justice initiatives

For nearly two decades, the Conine family has supported green spaces for recreation and conservation. In the past year their focus has been working in partnership with the local community to build and maintain a bike network in the Boston area that would safely and reliably connect people and places.

Programs Update: Advanced Mechanics Thank You City of Boston Environment Department

On Friday, January 21st, 2022, Mayor of Boston Michelle Wu announced Bikes Not Bombs as one of the recipients of the [City's Catalyst Grants for Green Job and Mobility Training](#), to help connect residents with career opportunities in the green economy.

The City of Boston's Environment Department awarded Bikes Not Bombs **\$138,232** to run its Advanced Mechanics program, which provides **hands-on training and career development to 21 Youth Apprentices**, ages 15-24. Over the six-month funding period, Youth Apprentices will participate three hours per day, three days per week, for twelve-weeks, in an 108-hour Advanced Mechanics course held at the BNB Retail Bike Shop and Vocational Training Center located in Jamaica Plain. With the support of peer leaders and two instructors — a professionally trained mechanic, and program coordinator, participants will build professional competencies in all operations of the BNB Bike Shop including, customer service, bike builds (new/used), bike repair (new/used), product inventory, sales, bike fitting, shop protocols, and work etiquette.

"With the City of Boston's funding, **Bikes Not Bombs will give Boston youth the opportunity for apprenticeship, skill building, and career development**. BNB uses the bicycle as a vehicle for social change – and this funding will open the door for Black and marginalized Boston residents to achieve economic mobility, build relationships, and work towards a healthier Boston," says Elijah Evans, Executive Director of Bikes Not Bombs.

Bikes Not Bombs is particularly honored to recognize **Janice and Joe Maienza** as our donors of the month. **Janice and Joe support Bikes Not Bombs in loving memory of their son, Matt.** The Maienzas remember Matt with their support of Bikes Not Bombs because of Matt's devotion to bicycles and the connection between Matt's life with BNB's mission and programs.

The Maienzas love BNB's model, where we train youth in bike mechanics. "It reminds me so much of Matt," said Janice, "he just loved bicycles." Matt was a hands-on learner who was self-taught. Taking advantage of every opportunity that came his way to learn about bikes, Matt attended the prestigious Barnett Bicycle Institute in Colorado on his way to becoming an expert bike technician, eventually gaining both skills and recognition. Matt became a specialist in shock systems in mountain bikes. He fine tuned this expertise as a technical advisor at the Fox Racing division. Fox sponsors its own

World Cup mountain bike race team, and Matt would travel with the team throughout the U.S., Canada, and Europe as a bike technician.

For Joe and Janice, BNB's alignment with Matt's life is mixed with their own feelings about how the world should be. Joe remarked, "we are children of the 1960s and have always wanted peace in the world. It is better to send a bike than a bomb. Bikes Not Bombs is such a good model to send things that help people rather than destroy their country."

The Maienzas are now working with Bikes Not Bombs planning a memorial, virtual bike ride in May. Stay tuned for more details! We are so honored to be a small part of celebrating Matt Maienza's life.
