**Charles T. Brown at the Bikes Not Bombs
Building Momentum Breakfast
June 17th, 2023 9:30 AM**



Racial injustices exist in all sectors, and transportation in the United States is no exception. **Black Americans and other people of color are disproportionately targeted, fined, and even jailed for innocuous acts** such as jaywalking and riding bicycles on the sidewalk. Traveling by foot, bicycle, or other transportation can be fraught with risks that reflect the structural racism in our society today. This discriminatory policing serves as the basis for Charles T. Brown's concept of Arrested Mobility.

These, among others, are the conclusions Brown and his colleagues found in their **2023 report, [Arrested Mobility](#)**. Charles T. Brown is founder and CEO of Equitable Cities, and the host of the [Arrested Mobility podcast](#). He is also Bikes Not Bombs' **keynote speaker at our annual [Building Momentum Breakfast on Saturday, June 17th 2023](#)** at 9:30 AM. You can hear Charles discuss why Black Americans and other people of color are disproportionately victims of overly aggressive police enforcement and brutality while walking, running, riding bicycles, or taking public transit, as he explores the ways in which people of color have their mobility arrested at this year's breakfast.

Alumni Engagement Coordinator

The Alumni Engagement Coordinator supports the re-engagement of Bike School and Youth Apprentice alumni. The Alumni Engagement Coordinator will work closely with our Youth Pathways team, with input from current alumni to develop strong relationships with our vast alumni network and support graduates in advancing their career aspirations. The Alumni

Engagement Coordinator understands and communicates the benefits of being part of a BNB alumni network that includes jobs, volunteer opportunities, discounts at our Bike Shop, community connections, events and rides, and career and workforce development support.

Bike School Mechanic Instructor

The Bike School Mechanic Instructor assists with our bike education and training programs that engage BIPOC youth in Boston. Primary duties include supporting our Bike School, Bike Match, and Tool Time programs in Roxbury, completing repairs and rebuilds (refurbishing donated bicycles for distribution), setting clear performance standards and providing training for how staff and volunteers work on bicycles. The Bike School Mechanic Instructor at the Roxbury Hub reports to the Bike School Program Manager at the Roxbury Hub, and is a member of the Community Engagement team. The Mechanic Instructor may also support the BNB bike shop as needed.

Senior Director of Development & External Affairs

The Senior Director of Development & External Affairs will lead our fundraising efforts as one of BNB's senior leaders. The Senior Director of Development will work closely with the Executive Director to shape and implement an effective fundraising strategy, with a particular focus on growing and sustaining relationships with individual donors, funders, government, and corporate partners as we grow our fundraising revenue goal from \$2,397,720 in FY22 to \$3,517,404 in FY23. The Senior Director of Development & External Affairs will draw on excellent interpersonal skills and a deep commitment to our mission to build strong relationships with members of our board of directors, staff, and current and prospective donors.

Deputy Director

The Deputy Director will primarily be charged with improving Bike Shop profitability, growing its overall annual revenue, expanding its role as a social enterprise expansion, and creating new job opportunities for Black and other marginalized youth in Boston. Additionally, this is an exceptional opportunity for a collaborative, driven, and inclusive leader with a proven track record of business management, financial oversight, creative problem-solving and change management to join in a growing high-impact, well-respected, mission-driven organization.

Reporting to and working closely as a partner with the Executive Director (ED), the Deputy Director will directly supervise up to a four-person team (Director of Bike Shop and Training Center, Bookkeeper/HR Coordinator, the Payroll Specialist, and CFO/Financial Consultant).
